Organization

During the online sessions, interactions between participants and the facilitators have the aim of introducing the topic and discussing the progress of participants. During the **online mentoring sessions**, the participants will have the opportunity to solve questions related to the assigned tasks in real-time, with the tutors and other participants. The estimated time to allocate to this workshop is between 4 to 6 hours per week.

Target audience

The workshop targets primarily students of MSc Tropical Forestry at the TUD who would like to develop their skills in project monitoring and evaluation using geographic information systems for further application on their research. However, students of development programmes in Germany, young researchers, and professionals with experience in international development projects who would like to further qualify and professionalize their skills are also welcomed to apply.

Participants are expected to commit to the entire duration of the workshop and participate in the planned online sessions to receive a certificate.
